Girls joined boys as the town's two grammar schools merged in 1973

THIS year Farnham seems to have more than enough anniversary dates but one which is of great significance to members of both the Farnham Grammar School (for boys) and Farnham Girls' Grammar School is the 40th anniversary of the amalgamation of the two schools, in 1973, to form the Farnham Sixth Form College.

This 'Forty-Years-On' landmark takes place in September.

However, the preliminary announcement about an event planned to mark the occasion on Saturday September 21st, 2013, (which will take place in the hall of the former FGGS building in Menin Way), also shows how much society - as well as education - has changed in the past four decades. Although the official closure dates of the two grammar schools was on September 5th 1973, it was decided to hold the Forty Years On celebration on the same day as had previously been arranged for the OGA's AGM but with a changed programme to suit the special occasion.
